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NOTICE UNDER SECTION 920E OF THE CORPORATIONS ACT 2001

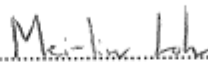
Notice is given under section 920E of the Corporations Act 2001 that the Australian Securities and Investments Commission has made a banning order in the terms set out below, which order took effect on 15th December 2015.

TAKE NOTICE that under sections 920A(1) and 920B(2) of the Corporations Act 2001 the Australian Securities and Investments Commission prohibits **Tony Davidof** from providing any financial services for a period of three (3) years.
