

EU final compliance report by ASIC

ASIC's final report dated 8 August 2018 on compliance with the s93AA ASIC Act enforceable undertaking given by Safe Worlds Internet Television Inc (**Safe Worlds**) and Mary Helen Metcalfe (**Mary Metcalfe**) dated 30 August 2017 (**the EU**).

Terms used in this report have the same meaning as in the 30 August 2017 enforceable undertaking.

<p>Report the fact of the EU to shareholders</p> <p>EU paragraph 3.1.4* and Annexure A</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Safe Worlds sent a copy of the EU and the letter in Annexure A of the EU to shareholders on 21 September 2017. 2. Although paragraph 3.1.4 of the EU required Safe Worlds to send these documents to shareholders within one week of the date of the EU being accepted by ASIC, ASIC agreed to an extension of time to account for a delay in Safe Worlds receiving the signed and dated EU accepted by ASIC.
<p>Register Safe Worlds as a foreign company</p> <p>EU paragraph 3.1.5</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Safe Worlds lodged an application with ASIC to register as foreign company on 18 September 2017, within the time frame set out in paragraph 3.1.5 of the EU. 4. Following processing of the application, Safe Worlds was registered as a foreign company on 3 November 2017.
<p>Provision of statutory declaration as to compliance with paragraphs 3.1.4 and 3.1.5 of the EU</p> <p>EU paragraph 3.1.6*</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. On 20 October 2017, Safe Worlds provided a statutory declaration made by Mary Metcalfe declaring that Safe Worlds had complied with paragraphs 3.1.4 and 3.1.5 of the EU. 6. Although paragraph 3.1.6 of the EU required Safe Worlds to provide the statutory declaration within six weeks of the date of the EU being accepted by ASIC, ASIC agreed to an extension of time to account for a delay in Safe Worlds receiving the signed and dated EU accepted by ASIC.
